⁸ Appointed to replace Hunt, and took office on January 2, 1988. Resigned September 28, 1995. He was again appointed on March 10, 1999, to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Billie Jean Pavlich and served until resigning on June 30, 2005.

⁹ Appointed to replace Street, and took office on October 2, 1995. She served until March 1, 1999, when she resigned the office and she passed away on October 1, 1999.

¹⁰ Appointed to replace Street, and took office on July 1, 2005. Elected 2006, 2008, 2012, 2016 and 2020.
